

Employment Opportunity – Communications Coordinator

West Coast N.E.S.T. (Nature. Education. Sustainability. Transformation.), a program of the Clayoquot Biosphere Trust, is seeking a Communications Coordinator to support the growth of education tourism programs throughout the Clayoquot Biosphere Region. The Communications Coordinator will:

- Support the creation and delivery of West Coast NEST programs by carrying out email, phone, and virtual correspondence with local education organizations and businesses, tourism staff, visiting and local learners, also by generating documents, updating spreadsheets, and completing reports;
- Promote education programs by updating the West Coast NEST website, creating and publishing an online newsletter, and creating and publishing social media content;
- Connect with local hospitality businesses to increase awareness of local education programming and promote the use of westcoastnest.org program calendars;
- Interview local knowledge holders, educators, organizations, and businesses, and write stories about learning experiences in our region and publish online to promote local education tourism;
- Support local education organizations by documenting their events and courses using a combination of photography and written content;
- Create and implement seasonal, thematic, or event/course-specific marketing campaigns;
- Prepare other materials to support marketing campaigns as needed, including content for publications such as Westerly News, Tofino Time, or other print materials; and
- Prepare summaries of marketing efforts as needed for reporting.

The successful candidate should have a positive attitude, strong interpersonal and communication skills, proficient English language and computer skills, the ability to work productively both in a professional shared office setting and from your home, and have an interest in communications, sustainable development, education, and/or tourism. Previous communications experience is an asset. Preference will be given to candidates living in the Clayoquot Biosphere region.

Wage: \$24.24/hour

Term: January 2023 for 3 months with possible extension.

Schedule and work hours: 37.5 hrs/week, typically 9am – 5pm, Monday – Friday. Some work outside of regular office hours may be required.

Location: Work will take primarily at the Clayoquot Biosphere Trust office at 316 Main Street, Tofino, or at your home office, depending on the current conditions and in order to ensure a safe and healthy working environment. Some regional travel required.
